5 REASONS TO VOTE PAUL BURROWS IN HELENSBURGH AND LOMOND SOUTH

1 Free travel for children on buses will help families and lone mothers whilst the preservation of the Strathclyde Concessionary Travel Scheme (SCTS) for the elderly and disabled is crucial. Paul Burrows will fight for both.

“ The bus and rail companies, especially in rural areas, are essential to the local economy. The SCTS is currently under review and I promise to fight to keep the scheme.

“ Free travel on buses for children will provide them with access to education, work, cultural and social opportunities, as well as alleviating some of the excessive burden upon parents who simply don't have the money. ”

2 Paul Burrows is the only candidate to come out from the start to back unequivocally Unite union members and workers at Coulport and Faslane who are under threat from further outsourcing. These jobs must be protected and decent rates of pay and conditions guaranteed.

“ I promise to fight for local opportunities to rebuild industry and infrastructure and protect local businesses, jobs, services and our natural environment. ”

3 The introduction of free collections for bulky waste has to be implemented by the Local Authority. The council has surveyed residents in an attempt to find evidence to increase the cost of bulky waste collections. The reality is that the removal of

this waste is a public health and environmental necessity. Fly tipping, even in the vicinity of the recycling centre, is yet more evidence that free collections are a necessity and in the long run will save money.

4 Paul is committed to the fight for free school meals for all children in our local authority schools.

“ 20% of children are living in poverty in Argyll and Bute, free school meals is an achievable and tangible remedy to the hunger experienced by many and I promise to fight to have this demand included in the councils Child Poverty Action Plan and to see it delivered in Helensburgh and Lomond South. ”

5 Provision of local healthcare services including all necessary support services for the disabled, as well as the elderly, cannot be left to the other parties who all represent the interests of the wealthy not the working class.

“ Our area has an ageing work force, with a projected 14% decrease in the working age population by 2035. Preserving, let alone cutting, the present level of service is just not an option. ”
