**WORKERS PARTY OF BRITAIN
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As we entered 2022 we were unprepared for the events that would soon explode onto the scene and dominate the political agenda in the country and for the party for the rest of the year. When Russian forces launched the Special Military Operation in late February 2022, it was not the beginning of hostilities, but rather the continuation of a bloody war which had raged since 2014.

Ukraine had been a country of 140 nationalities during Soviet times and ethnic origin had mattered little. Ukraine was a multinational state before 2014 in which nationality problems were largely non-existent. In 2014, the United States instigated a coup and the forces of nationalism, allied to the propaganda of Banderite neo-Nazism began to transform the climate in the Ukraine with extreme hostility directed towards the Russian speaking part of the population.

The 2014 coup brought ethnic issues onto the agenda and the ethnic Russian population in the east, opposed to the coup, rebelled against it. Thousands of lives were lost as the Ukraine government shelled the Donbas and then used the pretext of various diplomatic agreements to rearm and prepare to be used as a proxy in Nato's war on Russia.

Our party had no choice, based as it is upon sound anti-imperialist politics, to take a stand against the designs of Anglo-American imperialism. It would have been far easier to remain quiet. Indeed, quite a few detractors of our party, not least a small group within the party, chose this moment to accuse the party of being a reformist, electoral machine, a "social-democratic" party in the same mould as the imperialist Labour party. Just at the moment when our party threw itself into the work of exposing the role of Anglo-American imperialism and fighting almost single-handedly inside Britain for a principled anti-imperialist political response, the sectarian spirit of a small minority of self-proclaimed revolutionary socialists played the role of a Fifth column.

It is in this context the Workers Party carried out its political work in 2022 and set the course for 2023.

ELECTIONEERING

Though electoral campaigning was taken seriously and carried out professionally by our party, it was by no means the sole focus of our work in 2022. Party activists have been working to get our party off the ground. We have campaigned against the proxy-Nato war in Ukraine, defended democracy and the rightfully elected President of Pakistan, championed the cause of Julian Assange and worked as best we can to help break the labour movement from the suffocating embrace of the Labour party.

Across the country we gave our support to workers who came out on strike for better pay as inflation spiralled out of control and the Tory government fell into internecine warfare at the expense of the country.

LOCAL ELECTIONS 2022

In February 2022 the Workers Party of Britain agreed with the Trade Unionist and Socialist Coalition to avoid unnecessary electoral clashes and the party limited its electoral work in the May 2022 local elections accordingly. From March the Workers Party sat as an observer on the TUSC steering committee but chose not to subsume our electoral work into the TUSC. We therefore continue to carry out our own independent electoral work in a spirit of non-sectarian co-operation.

In the May 2022 local elections we stood in those areas where our party has branch building aims and objectives. We communicated a list of our seats to the TUSC steering committee. The party made impressive showings in West Yorkshire, Birmingham and London. In these local elections where the party has previously made links with the local community, we showed our ability to speak in a language that appealed to voters and won the trust of thousands. In areas where we had little previous campaigning the results reflected this. Our Top 5 results were:

Batley East - Aziz Daji - 1,161 votes (a remarkable 33%)

Heckmondwicke - Zahid Kahut - 952 votes (a respectable 21%)

Bordesley and Highgate - Ed Woollard - 247 votes – (15% with a drop in the Labour vote)

Somers Town - Awal Miah - 239 votes

Somers Town - MD Shah - 202 votes

ELECTORAL COMMISSION SANCTION

A letter from the Electoral Commission issued in 2022 explained that the party was guilty of two offences and though a sanction was considered, it was not in the end deemed appropriate. It was reported to the June NMC that:

1. Both offences were essentially for the same omission
2. That the omission was that following the Welsh Senedd election our Agent had incorrectly completed paperwork returns to the EC (Electoral Commission). When asked to correct the returns they were again completed incorrectly. The EC announced we were subject to an investigation & these communications were sent to the then Treasurer (Joti Brar). Correspondence was not answered within the EC timeframe and led to the judgement against us.

Consequently the NMC resolved to take “in-house” all Agent duties whilst we have limited numbers of candidates. Furthermore, the NMC appointed the actual responsible people as registered Treasurer’s and Nominating Officers, and removed those others.

SOLIDARITY WITH PAKISTAN

On 10 April 2022, the national assembly of Pakistan voted, by a majority of just two, in favour of a motion of “no confidence” in the government of Imran Khan, removing him from the office of prime minister. In his place, it elected Shehbaz Sharif. Mr Sharif hails from one of the two main political dynasties of Pakistan, the other being the Bhuttos. He is the younger brother of former prime minister Nawaz Sharif, who was removed from office by the country’s supreme court in 2017 because of undeclared and unexplained wealth.

After being installed as the new prime minister, Mr Sharif accused Khan’s government of being – “corrupt, incompetent and laid-back”.

The Sharifs and Bhuttos, who disagree with each other on almost everything else, were united in alliance after Khan’s 2018 electoral victory on a one-point programme of getting rid of his government.

"Welcome back to old Pakistan," said Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, the leader of the opposition People's Party of Pakistan and son of assassinated former prime minister Benazir Bhutto. "Democracy is the best revenge," he added.

His remarks can only have one meaning: namely, that, having got rid of someone whom they regarded as an outside intruder, Pakistan is back in the rotating grip of the Sharifs and Bhuttos, who have led several civilian governments since the 1970s, though for half of Pakistan's life since its birth in 1947 it was under open military rule.

Our party, though not aligned to Imran Khan in any way responded to this undemocratic charade and participated in rallies organised by the Pakistani community in Britain.

George Galloway travelled to Manchester to speak a rally for Imran Khan attended by a few thousand members of the local community, and comrade Ed Woollard spoke at a mass rally of 10,000 in Small Heath Park Birmingham.

Leaflets were prepared for these rallies and party members have continued to support the cause of democracy in Pakistan throughout 2022, the issue featuring regularly on Moats.

POLITICAL REPORT JUNE 2022

A meeting in early summer received a political report from George Galloway who emphasised our core mission during this period was being carried out to the best of our abilities and that the various reports demonstrated the impressive strides we had taken in difficult conditions.

Speaking of our current objectives George outlined three core aims:

Getting it right

meaning putting forward coherent and correct political analysis

Communicating well

meaning broad and accessible media work that articulates our various core political beliefs in a professional, engaging way, developing our capabilities and skills

To turn our influence into membership, and transform our membership into activity

meaning to inspire working people with a faith in their collective power, to appreciate and understand the varying levels of commitment members can make, and provide multiform ways for those members to get into activity.

The party has attempted to live by these guidelines.

BREAKING THE LINK BETWEEN THE LABOUR MOVEMENT AND THE LABOUR PARTY

To undermine, weaken and destroy the influence of the Labour party in the labour movement, it is necessary to carry out broad exposures of its policies, leading personalities and history. Once a socialist appreciates the origins, the social and political background to the Labour party's formation it is easier to understand its history and trajectory. That history is one of service to the ruling class, whether before or after Blair. Despite hundreds of thousands of well-meaning workers flocking to Labour's banner under Corbyn, the party's trajectory remained the same. The Labour party was unable to change its character despite Corbyn and these new members, like a leopard cannot change its spots.

Once socialists have understood the history of the Labour party and drawn the correct political lessons, is it enough to carry out propaganda in small, introverted pure groups devoted to the reading of pamphlets on this question? No it is not. Perhaps it is necessary, to preserve our revolutionary purity, to toll the bell and preach sermons to a labour movement that is wedded by a hundred threads to social democracy and the British ruling class? We think not.

Only broad exposures in front of the masses of working people can undermine a hundred plus years of habit and collaboration, and at the same time bring from the ranks of the workers those capable of taking the next step and joining our work. The time is ripe for such work.

The labour movement feels too little pressure upon it to reconsider its cosy

relationship with Labour, although we welcome all the signs that this situation may change, whether it be the disaffiliation of the Bakers Union or the militant remarks of Sharon Graham in defence of her members' interests. Despite all the crimes and insults committed against it, the British labour movement demonstrated over the course of the last twenty-five years its inability to make an organisational breach with social democracy and the Labour party, despite every provocation, to the detriment of trade unionists and their industries which were gutted as Labour assisted in the export of capital, attacks on working-class conditions, culture and habits.

The attack eventually led to a passive political backlash and the inglorious end of social democracy's attachment to its parliamentary 'heartlands,' its so-called 'red wall'. The failure to make an organisational break with Labour is matched with a failure to undertake a political break. In fact, if anything, it is the Labour party that, through expulsions and witch-hunting, is doing all that it can to free itself of all ties with the labour movement, excluding of course those financial ties which make the trade union movement a laughable cuckold to Labour and capitalism.

The political annihilation of Labour is a guarantee that the labour movement will be forced to think for itself, to look after the interests of its members without recourse to the political fortunes of a ship that is now scuttled. Such a situation, if coupled with militant and honest trade unionism, can lead to a growth and reinvigoration of the labour movement, free of the ties that shackled it to imperialism (for a period at least). Once again, it will be the job of socialists to struggle to put the working-class movement onto the firm foundations of revolutionary leadership and this time we must not fail.

TU WORK

On the industrial front our members have worked to carry this line out in practice, not merely on paper, in articles and in declaration. The work of the TU Group has proceeded throughout the year, despite difficulties, which have resulted in a new Secretary and committee for 2023.

In 2022, Party members were instrumental in various campaigns to raise the slogan of an 'independent trade union movement,' i.e., an attempt to

open up a discussion on the relationship between the trade unions and the Labour party. The ASLEF conference in 2022 ultimately decided to keep the Labour link, and whilst such a decision is disappointing it was not unexpected. Supporters of disaffiliation knew that it was going to be a difficult task extricating ASLEF from this abusive relationship.

The General Secretary Mick Whelan (who is regarded by all as a decent and principled man) sits at the head of a union alongside elements of a bureaucracy that are considered to have a vested interest in the Labour Party.

The disaffiliation motion in 2022 was an academic affair due to the nature of ASLEF's conference procedures which prescribe that any motion to disaffiliate must be in the form of a rule change. However, the rule change motion submitted to conference also indicated where supporters thought the future of the union should lie in the form of two additional clauses in the rule book.

These additional clauses would have prevented ASLEF from affiliating to any political party, therefore giving it political freedom to support other parties that were willing to support their policies and aims and would have also prevented ASLEF from supporting right wing parties because of this independence.

Supporters of the rule changes could see the bureaucratic machine work from the start to thwart the democratic process with leaked press releases to mainstream media and pointed articles in its union publications. It also seemed that Labour politicians were crawling over themselves to give ASLEF support for its policies in the run up to conference.

Some commented that they had seen more Labour support over the last six months than they've seen in their lifetime but of course it was all for show.

Political independence would have been the first step in recognising where ASLEF sat in the industrial and political landscape. Political independence is recognising that the politics of Great Britain has changed, and that the Labour Party has become so detached from the working class that it is no longer a reliable advocate.

It was also recognised that ASLEF is haemorrhaging members from the political fund (over 3,800 from a membership of just over 21,000 to date). Political independence would have been a good platform from which a cam-

paign to retain the political fund could have been launched showing the membership the benefits of such a policy and reconnecting politically with the membership.

This was the first salvo in a debate that will become more important in ASLEF's future as the industrial conflict unfolds in the fight to retain the pay, pensions and terms and conditions of its members. The Labour Party will revert to form and condemn ASLEF's strikes as they have started to do with the RMT's strikes and will continue to align itself firmly behind establishment.

This alongside the real threat to the existence of the political fund will hopefully show the grassroots members the folly of remaining affiliated to a party that does not have its interests at heart.

The TU Group has taken this analysis, applied not just to ASLEF but to the wider trade union movement and circulated more than 7,000 copies of a Workers GB Trade Union newspaper. The party organised a presence at the Durham Miners Gala in July and a TU Group public meeting was Chaired by General Secretary Paul Cannon in Manchester in November, addressed by Andy Hudd the VP of ASLEF and party leader George Galloway.

NEW PREMISES

By the Autumn of 2022 the Workers Party was effectively and then physically 'locked out' of its previous offices by a group of party members who found that they had competing demands on their time and organisational loyalty. The Workers Party therefore set up new offices and transferred to Committee Room, Moseley All-Services Club, 91 Church Rd, Moseley, Birmingham, B13 9EA.

Following on from this incident on Sunday 20 November the national members council reviewed the work of 2022 and prepared notes in preparation for its Annual Report. Reviewing the party output and having regard to the conflicting work pressures of a number of comrades, not least deputy leader Joti Brar, the following resolution was carried unanimously:

Resolution of demotion (Rule Book Point 8): This NMC of the Workers Party places on record its thanks to comrade Joti Brar for the services she has

rendered as Deputy Leader. In view of the conflicting demands on her work, the Workers Party removes Joti Brar from the NMC and position of Deputy Leader.

On Tuesday 22 November party leader George Galloway received notification from Joti Brar that she and a small number of supporters were resigning or withdrawing their support for the Workers Party.

MEMBERSHIP & FINANCES

A review of membership was begun in November 2022 and is ongoing. This has led us to delete from the database 783 lapsed members, supporters, affiliates, false contacts.

Membership of the party is open to all who agree with our party programme. Members may retain membership of other political parties if said membership does not contravene our political programme and rules, commonly referred to as 'The ten-point programme'.

The party has a number of internal tiers based upon contact with our supporters and members, which consider political commitment, length of service, and style of work. Membership is not dependent upon payment of subscription fees, although £28,693 was collected in 2022, whilst our outgoings were £31,753. Our supporters gave an additional £3,281 in one-off donations.

The total number of members, affiliates and associates held on our records in accordance with GDPR is summarised below.

MEDIA

Twitter - in January we had 18,800 followers, which increased to 19,700 followers by the end of May. Since then it has past the magic 20k and by the end of October we've hit 22,200 followers. The party has attempted to rely less on Twitter due to ongoing problems with our account that have not improved since the arrival of Mr Musk.

YouTube - we started the year with 2,145 subscribers, increasing to 2,510 by the end of May. This has increased to 2,862 as of the end of October.

TikTok - we started the year with 134 followers, which increased dramatically to 7,860 by the end of May and by the end of October to 11,900 followers. We seem to have free reign on Tik Tok with appeals against violations of community guidelines being successful and no obvious attempts to restrict our visibility.

Our most popular post for 2022 thus far is the 'Putin has a point' video in February which has now accumulated an astonishing 568,400 views. The next most popular was a video about sleepy Joe Biden and Cuba amassing 320,500 views.

Telegram - we launched our Telegram channel in January 2021. By the end of January 2022, we had 214 subscribers, which increased to 382 the end of May. As we moved away from a reliance on Twitter we have started to make more use of Telegram and by the end of October, we had 524 subscribers. The most viewed post this year was an advert for our V Day event in London with over 7,400 views. The second most popular was a promo for a Galloway Show episode on Ukraine, Russia, and Pakistan which garnered 7,000 views.

Instagram - we started this year with 835 followers on Instagram, increasing to 986 at the end of May. By the end of October, we had 1016 followers.

Facebook - In January we had 5,806, up to 6,394 by the end of May on our Facebook page. This stood at 6,430 followers by the end of October.

We've had multiple warnings from Facebook over our content. Despite challenging them, and asking them directly if restrictions are in place on our Facebook page, we are averaging a very low viewership of our posts at an

average of our 300 per day.

Podcasts - the podcast account has been set up via Soundcloud and is broadcasting via Google and Apple Podcasts as well as Spotify. Due to technical issues, we had to set up a new account, which was set up in May. The podcast is low priority for the party at the moment.

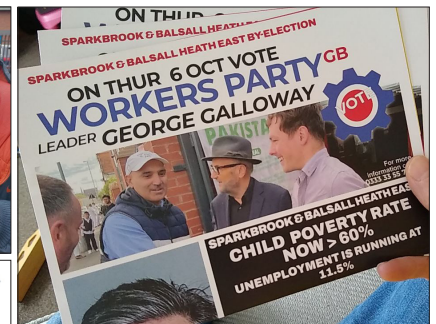
